Staffing news

Mrs Lucy Richens will be returning to work following her maternity leave on 11th December and will be teaching in Red Ladybirds. This means that Miss Anna Hill will be returning to teach in year 1 and sadly we will have to say goodbye to Mrs Rosie Mehmood who has been teaching Owls class. I hope that you will join me in wishing her every success and happiness in the future.

The Children's Learning

In Badgers, we learnt about the festival of Diwali. We made and then tasted Chapattis and learnt a Diwali dance. Some of the year 1 children joined the mainstream creepy critters workshop. We have also been working hard with our Maths - recognising numbers and adding 1 more to a group.



In Ladybirds, our topic this term is called 'Fall into Fairytales' and we have loved listening to and acting out a variety of different traditional tales, including 'The Three Little Pigs' and 'Little Red Riding Hood'. We have had excellent fun searching for the villain in these stories: The Big Bad Wolf! He has left clues absolutely everywhere! We started Forest School after half term, which we are really enjoying! We have learnt all of the Forest School rules, and we are especially good at holding sticks correctly, and walking back to base camp when the whistle blows. We have been busy searching for special treasures, making homes for the woodland animals, and of course, digging for worms and other minibeasts!



In year 1 we have continued our learning about 'Amazing Animals'. As scientists we have been learning to ask scientific questions and we were able to ask some of these questions during our amazing Animal Critters workshop. We were able to hold a banana snake, a tortoise and a bearded dragon, but the highlight was meeting Mr Poppy, a giant tortoise who roamed happily around the room during our session! In history, we have learnt that we can use different sources of information to learn about the past, such as fossils. We all pretended to be famous palaeontologists like Mary Anning, where we looked closely at several different fossils.



In year 2 the children have really enjoyed learning how to use a hand drill during Forest School sessions. They have been making Christmas decorations which will be completed in the coming weeks, ready to sell on our enterprise stall. Recently we were invited to Reigate Methodist Church to attend some Sparkfish sessions where the children were treated to an interactive Christmas story experience, they absolutely loved it, particularly the talking animals!



Confident Communicators 'Week' - 3 - 12 January

When the children return from their Christmas holidays, we will be holding our Confident Communicators week which will also link with the children studying The Umbrellas by Renoir. The year 2 children will be working with an artist on 9th and 10th January which has been funded by the PTA and all the children will be involved in workshops facilitated by The Magic Lantern charity to help them explore the themes and their feelings about the painting. I have attached our attendance policy to this newsletter for your information. This sets out our procedures for tackling low attendance because there is a wealth of research that shows that poor school attendance is associated with:

- lower academic achievement including literacy and numeracy
- early school leaving
- leaving school with fewer qualifications
- reduced opportunities for students to learn and access educational resources, further limiting achievement
- further absenteeism in higher year levels
- increased alcohol, tobacco, and substance use in adolescents.

We will be having a collection at the end of each performance. We all recognise the tough times in which we are living (and I'm aware that I have asked you several times in this newsletter for monetary donations), but if you can spare anything, monies raised will be given to Just 4 Children who are raising money to support Millie, whose brother is in Owls Class. I'm sure you'll agree that Millie's story is an inspirational one and it would be lovely to think that the Dovers Green Community have supported her and her family.





Millie is one part of twin girls and lives in the local community in Salford's, she needs your help! Our Princess Warrior was born at 29 weeks and was getting stronger every day in NICU to come home to her older siblings who were eagerly waiting. Unfortunately, at 8 weeks old, Millie required a simple procedure due to Hydrocephalus which went ahead at St George's hospital Jan 2022. The operation went well and she started to recover.

A few days later Mille became extremely unwell and they found she had caught an E.coli infection from hospital which had travelled to her brain. The E. coli infection caused meningitis and cranial cysts as her tiny body tried to fight off the infection. It took 5 months and 20 brain surgeries before Millie was safe to come home where everyday she inspires our family to keep going.

Because of the brain infection, Millie now has Cerebral Palsy and is visually impaired. Millie requires physio, groundbreaking therapies, adjusted everyday living, sensory and medical equipment and possible overseas corrective surgeries. So far the NHS has been fantastic however cannot give Millie all the support she needs to get moving.

Message from Millie - "I would love to be able to walk, crawl and see the world with my twin. My mummy has set up this charity as she believes in me but doesn't have the funds to support my needs. Please donate big or small to help me live a better life."

REMEMBER - School Admissions - Applying for a Place in Reception and Year Three

If your child is due to start school or transfer to a Junior school, please do remember that the closing date for applications is **15th January 2024**.

Children who were born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020 will be able to start school in September 2024 and those currently in Year two will transfer to Junior school at the same time. You can [apply online](#) for a September 2024 school place by visiting:
