Governors

What is the role of the Governors?

The role of the governing body is to help Dovers Green provide the best possible education for its pupils. Although the head teacher is responsible for the day-to-day management of the school and its internal organisation, the governing body oversees the running of the school, providing help and support in all aspects of school life. A governor's role is to challenge and monitor the school's strategy and vision to ensure the children receive the best education possible.

Who are the Governors?

School governors are volunteers drawn from all walks of life. They have a genuine desire to improve education for children and they give up their time freely and also attend courses to ensure that they are as knowledgeable as they can be. The head teacher is a governor. All governors have an initial period of office of four years although many serve far longer than this.

What do they do?

There is a School Committee meeting at least twice a term. The governing body fulfils its role in three basic ways:

By providing a strategic view

That is, helping to decide the school's strategy for improvement so that the children have access to a broad and balanced curriculum and achieve the highest possible standards.

By acting as a critical friend

Being critical in the sense that it has responsibility for monitoring and evaluating the school's performance and effectiveness. A friend because it exists to promote the interests of staff and pupils.

By ensuring accountability

The governing body holds the Headteacher and senior leadership team to account to drive up educational standards. It is responsible for its actions to parents and the wider local community and works very closely with the headteacher and staff.

Communication with parents

School Committee meetings at Dovers Green are open meetings and any parent is welcome to attend.

The Governing Body has recently been involved in the following:

- Participation in a Greensand Challenge visit where colleagues from other schools came to Dovers Green to evaluate our teaching of phonics, writing and the support that we give children in the writing process.
- Attendance at budget review meetings and health and safety visits.
- Learning walks and meetings with subject leaders.
