
Knowledge organisers

Attached to this newsletter is a 'Knowledge Organiser' which sets out the key knowledge your child will be learning in the main 'topic' aspect of their work in class. These will be used with the children in class to help reinforce and revisit their learning across the course of the unit of work. Research tells us that children (and adults!) need to retrieve information from their short term memories multiple times so that it is then transferred to their long-term memories and hopefully then sticks! You will see that the organisers also detail the vocabulary that we expect the children to know and be able to use. Please do use these at home with your children to talk to them about their learning in school.

Please note however, that sometimes things change and the teachers are responsive to the children's needs so sometimes learning and teaching speeds up or slows down accordingly.

Each child will be given a booklet of activities linked to our curriculum drivers that take their learning experiences beyond the Early Years and National Curriculums and very personal to the values and ethos that represents Dovers Green. Dovers Diamonds

Every week we identify and celebrate children who have demonstrated effort and perseverance in their learning and they are known as our 'Dovers Diamonds'. They get a certificate and their photograph will be displayed on a special board in the hall and they join me for 'biscuits and juice' on a Monday at 2.30 p.m. and bring their work to show me. If I am unavailable, Mrs Edwards will do this with the children.

School Council, Green Team and other monitors

During next week, the children will be talking about the different areas of responsibility in school that they would be interested in.

The School Council comprises two representatives from each class (Ladybirds from after Christmas) and they meet fortnightly to talk about ways that we can improve our school. Green Team also has two representatives from each class and meet fortnightly to discuss ways that we can be more eco-friendly. Children who are interested in either of these will prepare a little talk for the class explaining why they want to be part of these teams and the children will then vote who they would like to represent them thereby reinforcing our work on the British value of democracy. These children will be part of these teams for the academic year.

The children will also have the opportunity to be Playground friends and library monitors as well as other classroom monitor jobs. This will ensure that all children have the opportunity to have an area of responsibility over the course of the year.

Volunteer help in school



We welcome any parents and carers who would like to come in to school to help in anyway. We value any support that you can offer, whether it is accompanying children on school trips, helping in classrooms or attending and helping at our PTA events; your voluntary work is always greatly appreciated. There will be a meeting for interested volunteers on Monday 2 October at 9.00

a.m. in the school hall. This is a chance to explain the role in more detail, give out relevant

information and details about DBS checks, which are statutory for regular volunteers. I look forward to seeing familiar and new faces there to find out more about this role. If this is something that you would be interested in but cannot make that date, please get in touch with me and we will arrange an alternative time.

If you were a volunteer last year in school, have got your DBS certificate in place and you would like to come into school again, please can you speak directly to your child's class teacher so that a mutually convenient time can be arranged.

Earrings

A plea! Due to health and safety, your child cannot participate in PE lessons if they are wearing earrings. Therefore, please can you avoid getting your child's ears pierced unless they are done during the summer holidays and have time to heal so that they can be removed. Unless your child can take their own earrings out, please make sure you remove them on the days that your child is timetabled for PE. Thank you for your cooperation on this matter.

Communication



In any organisation communication is key and we take great care and a lot of time ensuring that every piece of information you receive is important and relevant to your child. School newsletters are circulated on the first working Friday of each month. Curriculum information in the form of

'Knowledge Organisers' are sent home at the beginning of each term. An Events for Next Week reminder is sent home every Friday to keep you up to date with upcoming events and also includes the school menu for the following week. The outside notice boards, blackboards and the windows are also used to display information.



Our website is also a great source of information and will be used to notify you together with ParentMail of any emergency closures.

Communication works both ways and the Parents Forum is an excellent way of making improvements across the school. Ideally, each class has a 'Class Rep' who attends each Parent forum meeting. We meet every half term and it gives an opportunity for parents to share thoughts and views about our school. Meetings usually last 30 - 45 minutes. If this is something you would be interested in or carrying on with, please can you email info@dovers-green.surrey.sch.uk

We have an open-door policy at Dovers but it is really helpful that unless it is urgent, you speak to class teachers at the end of the day if you have anything you need to discuss with them. This is because they are preparing for lessons for the day and need to settle all children in to the school day so that they are ready for learning. You can also help to make the start of the day calm and organised by saying goodbye to your child on the playground rather than accompanying them to the door. I promise, they can do it by themselves!

You are welcome to come into the classrooms on a Friday after school to share with your child what they have been learning in school. This is not meant to be an opportunity for you to talk to your child's teacher in depth about their progress. If you have any concerns or questions, please contact your child's teacher to make an appointment to do this.

Absences

If your child is unwell please update Study Bugs or telephone the school as early as possible in the morning leaving a message on the designated absence line. Alternatively you can send an email to info@dovers-green.surrey.sch.uk. The school will require written confirmation from parents who have not contacted us to give the reason for their child's absence. For your information, the latest recommendations from the Health Protection Agency states that:

Children who have been unwell with diarrhea or a vomiting illness should be kept off school for 48 hours from the last episode of diarrhea or vomiting.

Attendance

We know that regular school attendance is crucial to children making the best possible progress. There are times of course when a child is not well enough to be in school but we also recognise that there are times when they may not feel 100% but could be in school; we will always contact you if a child is really not well and ask you to take them home.

Being at school on time is also of vital importance. All children should be in school and ready to learn by 8.50 a.m. as that is when lessons formally begin.

To encourage good attendance we:



 Each week, children who have been on time and in school every day (excluding medical appointments) will be given a 'Golden Ticket.' This will then be put in a jar and one will be drawn out at the end of each half-term and the winner in each class will get a special prize. The more tickets your child has in the jar, the better the chance they have of winning!

Our aim is to help the children understand the importance of punctuality and having a strong work ethic that will stay with them as they get older.

Holidays in Term Time



It is a legal requirement for children to attend school and as I have already said, at Dovers Green we place great importance on high attendance as it leads to high achievement. Government legislation states that it is illegal to take children out of school for holidays during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

There is **no** entitlement to any leave of absence for a holiday during term time. Taking a holiday without authorisation can have an impact on a child's learning. The Local Authority may issue a fixed penalty fine where an unauthorised holiday has been taken. The fixed penalty fine is collected and kept by the Local Authority, not the school. Sadly, we do know that some parents tell us their child has been unwell when they have actually been on holiday. This gives the child mixed messages about being honest, a value which we teach children is very important.

Exceptional circumstances may include.....

• Where it is company/organisational policy for an employee to take leave at a specified time in the year and there is no opportunity for a family holiday in school holidays. This must be supported by documentary evidence from the organisation.

- Service personnel returning from/scheduled to embark upon a tour of duty abroad.
- Where a holiday is recommended as part of a parent or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue. Evidence must be provided, from qualified professionals, such as a doctor.

Applications for leave of absence for a holiday should always be made well in advance on the correct form obtainable from our School Office, or it can be downloaded from our school website and returned to myself.



Reading



Reading has the highest priority at Dovers Green; not only does it unlock learning across the curriculum but also provides an enormous amount of pleasure. You can really support your child to develop their reading skills by reading with them as often as you possibly can. We want children to feel like they are good readers so it

is important that the books that they read have the right level of challenge. If your child stumbles over words, encourage them to use their phonic skills to decode it, if it is a 'regular' word and read it for them if it is a tricky word. Whatever you do, don't cover the pictures! They provide valuable clues for the children as they learn to read.

Your child will be bringing home at least three reading books each week:



- 1. A Read Write Inc book which will closely match your child's phonic ability and they should be able to read this to you. They will keep this book for a week so that they can develop fluency and expression as they practise reading it several times. This book will be changed at least weekly by the class teacher or TA.
- 2. A 'Sharing book.' This will be a book from another reading scheme and may contain a few words that your child may need some help with reading. Please read this book first of all to your child to familiarise them with any unknown or tricky words and support them in subsequent readings until they are able to read it independently. You can come into school at the end of the day to change this book if you would like to.
- 3. A 'book corner' book which your child will have chosen themselves from the class book corner. They may be fiction or non-fiction books. This is a book to share or to be enjoyed on their own. Again, this can be changed throughout the week if appropriate.

The library will be up and running from Monday 11 September so please feel free to come and browse the library books with your child any day after school. Any books that are being brought back should be put on/in the book returns unit. Chosen books must be scanned out. The children have been taught how to take books out and return them, but if they forget, there are instructions to act as a reminder and there will always be staff around who can help. All our library story books are marked with a green and yellow sticker to help the children remember which of their books belongs in the school library. Those story books without a green and yellow sticker are classroom library books.

If you want to learn more about how we teach reading and other key literacy skills, please come along to our Curriculum Evening for Parents on Thursday 5^{th} October 7.00 - 8.30 p.m. More information will be sent nearer the time. This evening will also give you lots of helpful tips about how you can support your child's learning at home. We hope to see as many of you as possible!

Clothes Recycling Bin

We have a clothes recycling bin outside Blue Ladybirds. As well as recycling being great for the environment it will also help raise funds for our school.

If the bin is full, please can you let the office know and we can contact Astra to come and empty this!



Astra Recycling is a textile recycling company looking to reduce the amount of clothing sent to landfill. On average, each person in the UK throws 3.1 kilos of clothing away a year, producing around 206.456 tonnes of textile waste in a year! Clothes can take up to 40 years to decompose and shoes up to 1000 years to break down, but 95% of these can be recycled!

The textiles collected are either sent to Eastern Europe to be used again or converted into insulation materials and industrial cleaning wipes, so nothing goes to landfill!

Home School Link Worker (HSLW)



Mrs Lisa Brewis is our Home School Link Worker. Her HSLW role is to further develop positive home school relationships, working closely with both families and the school to help ensure that every child has the opportunity to fulfil their potential.
