



# Dovers Green School October 2023 Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

The first month of the new school year has been completed and what a busy time we have had at Dovers Green! We are delighted with how well all of the children, but especially our youngest children in Ladybirds and Badgers, have settled into the routines of school.

### Ladybirds

The children in Ladybirds have all settled in brilliantly to life at school, and are learning the rules and routines really well! We have been learning how to play in all of the different areas in our environment and have enjoyed using the mud kitchen, the climbing frame, planting bulbs ready for the spring time, the sandpit and the bikes, as well as all of the opportunities inside, such as the water trays and of course, junk modelling! It has been a busy start to the term! Our first topic 'All About Me' started this week, and we have been learning to talk about our families and about where we live. We have drawn some excellent maps! A really great start to the term!



## Badgers

In Badgers we have been learning all about ourselves and our families. We have made timelines of our lives looking at the past and now. We have compared our families and looked at how they are the same and different to our friend's families. We have also drawn our self-portrait. In Forest School we made our faces from clay and autumn items.







In year 1 we have been learning all about animals including what they look like and what group they belong to-mammals, birds, amphibians, reptiles and fish. In maths we have been developing number fluency by learning to represent numbers to ten in different ways and to identify one more and one less. In English we have just started to explore the text, 'Cave Baby'. In Forest School we have been learning to work together to build 'caves' for our cave babies! We have been focusing on writing simple sentences with correct punctuation and we have been learning to use descriptive language to describe different Stone Age animals.







Year 2



The children in **year 2** have settled back into school really well. They have particularly loved being back in Forest School where they have been recapping the rules, exploring the area and discussing seasonal changes. During outdoor games they have been having agility lessons which have involved an active warm up (like in the photo) followed by work using our agility ladders. This has involved careful footwork and lots of concentration!

#### The Dovers Green School vision

I am in the process of reviewing our school's mission, vision and aims. A mission statement encapsulates who we are and what we value whereas a values statement is about what we want to become. These statements act as guides for our decision making, resource allocation and policy decisions.

## **Clothes Recycling Bin**

Please remember that there is a clothes recycling bin outside Blue Ladybirds. As well as recycling being great for the environment it will also help raise funds for our school.

If the bin is full, please can you let the office know and we can contact Astra to come and empty this!

Astra Recycling is a textile recycling company looking to reduce the amount of clothing sent to landfill. On average, each person in the UK throws 3.1 kilos of clothing away a year, producing around 206.456 tonnes of textile waste in a year! Clothes can take up to 40 years to decompose and shoes up to 1000 years to break down, but 95% of these can be recycled!



The textiles collected are either sent to Eastern Europe to be used again or converted into insulation materials and industrial cleaning wipes, so nothing goes to landfill!
