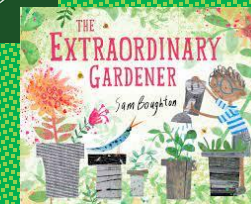

Key Vocabulary

Habitat: the natural home or environment of an animal, such as a **warren**, **sett**, **den**, **burrow** and **nest**.

Nocturnal: animals, who are awake at night.

Parts of a Plant: **seeds**, **stem**, **roots**, **leaves** and **flowers**.

Nutrients: essential elements that plants use for growth and development.

Sunlight: plants need light from the sun to grow.
