Key Vocabulary

Habitat: the natural home or environment of an animal, such as a warren, sett, den, burrow and nest.

Nocturnal: animals, who are awake at night.

Parts of a Plant: seeds, stem, roots, leaves and flowers.

Nutrients: essential elements that plants use for growth and development. Sunlight: plants need light from the sun to grow.
