Key Knowledge

Ernest Shackleton was an explorer and a sailor. He is significant because he is considered to be one of the most inspirational explorers and leaders of the 20th Century. He carried out expeditions by ship to Antarctica.

HMS Endurance was the ship Shackleton and his men sailed on from 1914-1917 on their Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition.

Dwayne Fields is the first British black man to visit the North Pole. He has also been on an expedition to the South Pole.

Jackie Ronne was the first woman to be part of an expedition to Antarctica in 1946-48.

Antarctica is the heaviest, driest, coldest and windiest continent.

The closer you get to the Equator the warmer the climate is and the further away you get from the Equator the colder the climate is.

The ocean can be a dangerous place and there are safety procedures in place to help people stay safe at sea.

The world is made up of seven continents. These are: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Australia

There are five oceans across the world: Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Arctic and Southern.
