It is hard to believe that we are fast approaching the halfway point of the school year! Spring is just around the corner! The children's learning

In Badgers we visited The New Leaf Cafe for our Geography learning. We used a map of the local area to find the cafe, we ordered our own food and drink using the menu and then each paid for what we had ordered using real money. We had a fabulous time and can't wait to go back!



In Ladybirds, we have really enjoyed learning all about the story 'The Magic Paintbrush' by Julia Donaldson. A very special paintbrush was delivered to our classrooms, and we painted objects which magically came to life, just like in the story! We have learnt all about China and we have enjoyed ordering food and eating in our Chinese restaurant! We have listened to Chinese music and watched traditional Chinese dancing! Our favourite learning of all was when we tasted Chinese food, including noodles and prawn crackers! Yum!



In year 1 we have enjoyed learning all about Space. We have learnt that there are significant individuals who have contributed to national and international achievements, for example Neil Armstrong and Helen Sharman, who was the first British astronaut to go into space in 1991. In science we have been learning to identify and describe the properties of a range of materials. The children were challenged to build a bridge which would be strong enough to hold an egg! In DT we have been learning to use tools to prepare food safely. We were able to put our skills to good use by preparing food for our Cultural Celebration event. A highlight was making samosas alongside an actual chef!



In year 2 the children had a wonderful cultural afternoon where they sampled food from around the world, including Egypt, China, America and India. They were very adventurous when trying the different foods and it promoted some great discussions. For our outdoor PE lessons this half term the children are learning how to play hockey. They are practising holding the stick correctly; remembering at no point must they raise their stick above their waists! They will be learning the basic skills of controlling the ball, passing and shooting which will all work towards being able to play a match.







Attendance



The Government has recently launched a campaign to improve school attendance. At Dovers Green, our attendance has traditionally been above National Average, but last half-term dropped to below national, due mainly to some rather nasty sickness bugs that swept through the school!

I cannot stress how important good attendance is to children's

achievement and over all wellbeing. There are of course times when a child is too unwell to come to school but if in doubt, we would prefer that you send them in; we will always contact you if we feel they need to go home. There are of course enormous health benefits for the children if they walk, bike or scoot as well as reducing the environmental and congestion impact that using cars to take children to and from school has. Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is the UK's largest walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge. It inspires pupils to make active journeys to school, improve air quality in their neighbourhood and discover how these changes benefit their world.

15th Big Walk and Wheel challenge

Help us to celebrate the 15th year of Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel and make it the biggest one yet. Active travel is a great way to build physical activity into children's daily routine. It helps them arrive to school more relaxed and alert, and is great for their mental wellbeing too.

This year the challenge will run from **11–22 March 2024**. It is free and easy to take part in Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel. You can register your school for the challenge from Janurary 2024 at **www.bigwalkandwheel.org.uk**.

How it works

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils walking, using a wheelchair, scooting or cycling to school.

A school's best five days will determine their final position and schools at the top of their leaderboards will receive an exclusive Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel certificate.



All schools will be entered into daily prize draws for rewards if over 15% of your school takes part on each day of the challenge. Prizes up for grabs include accessories and equipment to help your school travel actively.
