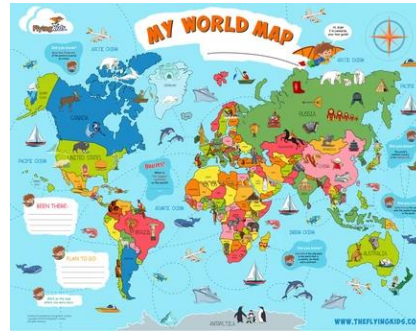


## As Scientists we will be:
